We're excited to invest \$8.36 million for Stage One of the Alfred Road Reserve sports complex. This first stage of the project will include the development of four ovals.

This project boosts our capacity to provide quality sporting grounds for our growing municipality.

We're also preserving our natural assets and protecting the K Road Cliffs from further erosion with more than \$5 million allocated for the Wyndham Coastal and Marine Management Plan and drainage works at K Road Cliffs.

These unique, red cliffs are beloved by locals and one of the many tourist attractions in Werribee South.

We'll also deliver \$5 million toward construction of the Black Forest Road South Community Centre, \$3 million in road and drainage works in Little River and planning will also take place for the extension between Ballan Road and Sayers Road.

Dogs of Harrison will be delighted to know that construction has begun on the new Williams Landing dog-off-leash park. Thoughtfully designed, the park will have activity spaces for dogs who like to zoom and a quiet space for pups who want to relax.

We are also pleased to be putting the finishing touches on the upgrade at Truganina's Aquarius Street Reserve, which will be a lovely space to play and gather with Spring just around the corner.

The Main Outfall Sewer (MOS) reserve along the Federation Trail is undergoing a remarkable and city-shaping transformation. The Greening the Pipeline project aims to revitalise the heritage-listed MOS reserve, turning it into a vibrant parkland and community space.

Construction of the Arndell Park Stormwater Harvesting System will be completed in the coming months. Topsoil, grass installation and reed bed planting are finalised, and works continue with connecting the pipe network to the stormwater collection area.

This system will provide a sustainable water source for the new trees and plants we are growing along the pipeline. The water will also irrigate the sports fields at Forsyth Road Reserve next to the Arndell Park Community Centre.

A community garden and landscaping works between Forsyth Road and Skeleton Creek are now completed, and work is continuing on the realignment of the Federation Trail in this section of the pipeline.

An education shelter is also under construction and will be a terraced outdoor learning and gathering space for school and community groups and anyone who wants to meet and connect in a green and serene setting.

To complete this work safely, detours will remain in place until late 2023, and we thank all walkers and riders for their patience.

Once completed, the new linear parkland, with its dynamic features, sustainable design and green spaces, will bring a breath of fresh air to residents within the area.

The project is a collaborative effort between Wyndham City Council, Melbourne Water, Greater Western Water, the Department of Energy, Environment and Climate Action, the Department of Transport and Traditional Owners.

Wyndham City Council is working with the Bunurong Land Council Aboriginal Corporation to ensure that Traditional Owner interests and values are incorporated into the park's design and creation.

Funding for this project comes from multiple sources, including the Victorian Government's Suburban Parks Program, an Integrated Water Management Grant and More Trees for a Cooler Greener West, Greater Western Water's Stormwater Harvesting Partnership fund and Melbourne Water's Living Rivers program.

KICKING GOALS ON SPORTING INFRASTRUCTURE UPGRADES

We're nearing the finish line on a series of sporting infrastructure upgrades, with a resurfaced BMX start hill and lighting upgrades some of the projects recently completed or underway.

The Wyndham Warriors BMX track in Hoppers Crossing has received a new lease on life following work to resurface the start hill, providing a smoother surface that not only enhances the track's safety but also ensures it is competition ready.

Over at Williams Landing Reserve, Wyndham City has installed fences around the soccer pitches as a safety measure to prevent balls from going on roads and people chasing after them.

Galvin Park soccer pitch 1 has received an illuminating upgrade with lighting

installed, allowing for evening training and matches.

Meanwhile, the installation of lighting at Price Reserve in Werribee South is now complete and works are underway on barrier netting at Saltwater Reserve in Point Cook, with goal netting to follow at Tarneit's Goddard Street Reserve.

These important works deliver massive benefits to Wyndham's host sporting clubs, spectators and visiting teams and there's more to come – watch this space for updates!

THE DAVIS AND DOHERTYS ROAD INTERSECTION IS GETTING AN UPGRADE!

Construction will commence shortly on the \$5.7 million Wyndham City project, which includes a full reconstruction of the Davis and Dohertys Road intersection with traffic lights and sealed shoulders to improve road safety for drivers, make the road smoother and provide a more enjoyable journey.

Work also includes the reconstruction of Davis Road south of the intersection up to Twyford Way, and reconstruction of Davis Road north of the intersection up to Tarnala Road.

Other improvements include public lighting, a footpath, bicycle lane and drainage works.

The Davis and Dohertys Road intersection will be closed to traffic throughout the duration of works, which will fast-track delivery of the project and reduce the project cost.

These works will enhance safety at this intersection and accommodate growing traffic needs in this part of Tarneit.



Three stormwater treatment wetlands have received a treatment of their own, each scoring an upgrade and we couldn't be happier with the results!

We've made improvements to the Amber Place and Flinders Crescent wetlands in Wyndham Vale, and the Lysterfield Walk wetland in Manor Lakes, including new plants to soak up pollutants and remove sediment from the surrounding rainwater.

At Amber Place, the wetland has been reshaped to improve its overall performance and a gross pollutant trap has been installed to capture up to 99% of litter and solid waste from the drainage system.

A new boardwalk has also been installed to give nearby residents the opportunity to enjoy a nice meander around the wetland.

These works improve water quality in our natural waterways and provide both a nurturing habitat for wildlife and a pleasant place for neighbouring residents and passers-by.

And there's more to come over 2023/24 – watch this space!

ATTENTION WYNDHAM DOG OWNERS!

We're wagging our tails with joy as work on the new Williams Landing dog off-leash park begins!

Located within Williams Landing Boulevard Reserve along Chessington Drive, the park will include a fenced-off dog off leash area with three distinct zones: a large lawn area for dogs to run around and interact in, an activity space with agility equipment, and a quiet area for smaller and older dogs.

Other features include a drinking fountain, seating, dog litter bag dispenser and bins.

And there's more to come – construction on the Bulban Road Dog Off-Leash Park in Werribee is nearing completion and is expected to open to the public soon.

Meanwhile, work on a new dog off-leash area at The Strand Park in Point Cook is expected to start later this year, while planning is underway on new dog off-leash parks at Cambridge Reserve in Hoppers Crossing and Alcock Road Reserve in Truganina.

These projects are being delivered as part of the *Wyndham Dog Off-Leash Plan 2022* and Wyndham's Open Space Strategy, both of which strive to provide accessible and well-connected open spaces for families and their pets.



ON THE DRAFT WYNDHAM HOUSING AND NEIGHBOURHOOD CHARACTER STRATEGY 2023

Wyndham is growing at a rapid pace and over the next 20 years our population is expected to grow by more than 200,000 residents. To accommodate our growing future population, we need to carefully plan to ensure that new housing is well located and well designed to meet the needs of our diverse community.

The Draft Wyndham Housing and Neighbourhood Character Strategy 2023 will play an important role in helping to guide the location and design of new housing across Wyndham's residential areas. It prioritises the development of new homes in areas that are close to existing and proposed services and transport. It also sets out an action plan that will support Council in planning for greater housing diversity and high quality design.

The 2023 Strategy identifies three broad categories of housing change, which each play a different role in accommodating future housing growth and diversity. It also identifies neighbourhood character precincts that will guide new development in a way that responds to the preferred character.

This portfolio celebrates the many tourism attractions Wyndham has to offer and explores ways Wyndham can continue to attract visitors and businesses to the region by developing strategies to capitalise on Wyndham's natural assets and local attractions.

Wyndham has grown from strength to strength in building our reputation as a tourism destination with Werribee being selected as a finalist in the 2023 Top Tourism Town Awards is testament to this

The COVID-19 pandemic had a huge impact on Wyndham's visitor economy, however, it's pleasing to see visitation levels have almost recovered to pre-pandemic levels for 2022, (1.5 million visitors) down just three per cent on pre-pandemic levels.

According to Tourism Research Australia, a total of 83 per cent of Wyndham's 1.5 million visitors are day trippers while only 14 per cent are overnight visitors, yet domestic overnight visitors generate 56 per cent of the total visitor spend of \$395 million, highlighting the significant opportunity this brings.

Our City has so much to offer, and many attractions ranging from the Werribee Open Range Zoo, Victoria State Rose Garden, Werribee Mansion, Shadowfax winery, Werribee Park National Equestrian Centre to the impressive natural wonders of the K Road Cliffs, Point Cook Coastal Park, Werribee South Foreshore, Wyndham Harbour, Riverbend Historical Park, Cobbledicks Ford, Werribee River and the Western Treatment Plant.

There is no need to leave Wyndham when family and friends come to visit, you can go to a theatre show, see an exhibition, enjoy high tea at the Refectory Parlour or play mini golf at Wyndham Harbour. Pop into the Visitor Information Centre to find out more.

Citizenship soars AT WYNDHAM

The number of Wyndham residents waiting to become Australian Citizens has decreased substantially following a major push.

Almost 7,000 residents can now officially call Australia home after Wyndham City increased its Citizenship Ceremonies to deal with a backlog of applicants, primarily due to several years of Covidrelated restrictions.

From January to the end of April, Council has delivered 25 Citizenship Ceremonies including three 'Super Ceremony Days', where for the first time, 500 residents were invited to be conferred at each ceremony.

Over these 25 ceremonies, 6.926 residents were conferred in the first four months.

By the end of June 2023, Council had delivered 32 ceremonies, inviting 8,560 Wyndham residents to be conferred as Australian Citizens.


The annual contemporary art prize attracts entries from some of the best artists across Australia and offers a chance for local and emerging artists to exhibit alongside them.
