Welcome to another edition of Wyndham News.

I am very excited to announce that over the next few months I will be holding a series of Mayoral Morning teas with the first one being held on Monday 24 April from 10am at the Wyndham Civic Centre.

It's an opportunity to meet, have a chat and learn more about Wyndham and the services we provide our residents. This may be of particular interest to our new residents.

I will be sharing all the details of how to register at either your local Community Centre, our website and via The Mayors Facebook page, so please keep a look out as numbers will be limited.

We know how important citizenship is to you all, so I'm also pleased to report that after a significant effort from Council, we are moving through the backlog of residents waiting to officially become Australian citizens.

At the start of January, more than 4,500 residents were awaiting their ceremony and around 900 new residents were being added each month to the list.

I'm pleased to say in the three months from January to the end of March, we will have held 22 Citizenship Ceremonies, conferring 5,870 new Australians.

This is a wonderful achievement, and I would like to thank everyone involved for their hard work and warmly welcome each new citizen.

Hopefully see you out and about in our community soon.

WYNDHAM'S NEWEST COMMUNITY AND FAMILY CENTRES!

More support, connection and learning opportunities are available for residents in Tarneit and Manor Lakes.

BEMBIT BAG-ROOK COMMUNITY CENTRE

Located next door to Nearnung Primary School, the new Bembit Bag-rook (previously 'Tarneit North') Community Centre in Tarneit is part of the delivery of a \$21 million Tarneit North Community Precinct Masterplan.

At this centre, residents can access modern facilities, services and programs, children have started kinder and Maternal Child Health Service will be available soon.

In Bunurong language, 'Bembit' means flower and 'Bag-rook' means women.

This brand-new centre is operated by Wyndham City's partner Bestchance and features include a fully equipped kitchen, full disability access, Free WIFI, BBQ and children's play area and Electric vehicle charging stations.

Residents can look forward to a range of community, health and educational services, programs, and activities for people of all ages, backgrounds and abilities.

You can also hire spaces in the centres to host private functions, classes and meetings. Have an idea for a new community group or activity? Reach out to the team at Bembit Bag-rook Community Centre to bring it to life!

Delivery of the Bembit Bag-rook Community Centre was supported by \$2.5 million from the Victorian Government's Growing Suburbs Fund and a \$2.5 million Building Blocks Grant.

BIRNBIAL FAMILY CENTRE

The new \$8.2 million Birnbial (previously 'Manor Lakes North') Family Centre is located at 84 Holyoake Parade in Manor Lakes, just a two-minute walk from Ngarri Primary School.

Birnbial (pronounced Bin-beel) is a Wadawurrung word for rainbow, and this name reflects the aspiration of this family centre to promote bright futures for a diverse, emerging community.

Managed by KU Children's Services, the centre will provide essential services locally, including three and four-year-

old kindergarten and maternal and child health in a safe and welcoming environment. A Toy library will also soon be available at this centre!

This centre was built with support from the Victorian Government with \$1 million from the Growing Suburbs Fund and \$3 million Building Blocks Infrastructure Fund. The toy library is supported by \$20,000 from the Federal Government.

AQUARIUS STREET RESERVE IS GETTING AN UPGRADE!

An exciting Wyndham City upgrade of Truganina's Aquarius Street Reserve is now underway.

The project includes an improved kick-about space, an expanded and upgraded path network, new BBQs, upgraded park furniture, new bike hoops, new toilets, more nature play, rubber softfall areas at the playground and more garden beds and trees.

Work is expected to be complete in mid-2023.

The upgrade will elevate Aquarius Street Reserve to a district level park, meaning it will cater not only for Truganina residents but also the wider Wyndham community.

It will improve the overall accessibility, functionality and landscape quality of Aquarius Street Reserve, providing a more diverse range of recreational opportunities for you to enjoy.

POINT COOK RESERVES REACH KEY MILESTONE

Wyndham City is kicking goals on two new Point Cook sport and recreation facilities.

Stage two of the \$15.95 million Webster Street Reserve is now complete, delivering a senior cricket oval and four soccer pitches.

This follows the recent opening of seven tennis courts and one multi-use court, cricket nets and landscaping at Webster Street Reserve.

Construction is now underway on two sporting pavilions, which will deliver change rooms, social spaces, storage, kitchens, umpire rooms and a car park and landscaping.

The pavilions, which will service cricket, soccer and tennis clubs, have received \$800,000 through the Victorian Government's Local Sports Infrastructure Fund.

Meanwhile, the \$5.6 million Brookdale Road Reserve has also reached a key milestone, with work complete on a baseball and softball field that includes behind diamond fencing, a batting cage structure and baseball clay surface.

This follows the opening of a new playground, ninja warrior course, exercise area, landscaping and car park in late 2022.

The final piece of the puzzle is a sporting pavilion that will service the baseball and softball field and is expected to be completed, alongside associated landscaping, in late 2023.

Both reserves also include automated irrigation systems using recycled water, fencing and energy efficient LED sportsground lighting.





MOONDARA STREET PARK UPGRADES COMPLETE!

Have you seen the newly improved Moondara Street Park?

We've included new playground equipment across two playground areas for junior and senior play, nature play areas, a half-court with basketball and netball hoop, picnic facilities and BBQ, upgraded pathways and more.

This \$1.2 million Wyndham City upgrade gives Tarneit residents a much-improved outdoor gathering space and a fun area for children of all ages.

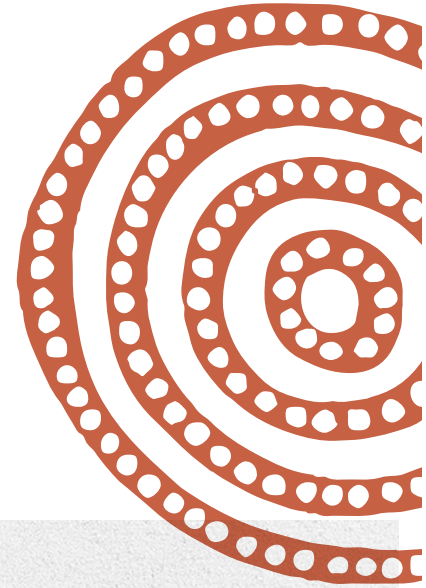
The works are part of Council's strategy to address ageing infrastructure across Wyndham, with Council investing \$19.8 million over 2022/23 on new and improved parks, open spaces and streetscapes to help you get out of the house, enjoy nature and be active.

HOWZAT! CHECK OUT THE NEW AND IMPROVED MANOR LAKES COLLEGE OVAL

The Manor Lakes College Oval upgrade is now complete!

The \$1.37 million project includes a full reconstruction of oval 2, lighting, and construction of a new practice cricket net enclosure.

The upgrade was fully funded by the Victorian School Buildings Authority's Shared Facilities Fund, which delivers community infrastructure on school sites that can be used by both the school and neighbouring community.



Tell us what you think about the 2023-2025 RECONCILIATION ACTION PLAN

Wyndham City's Draft Reconciliation Action Plan 2023-2025 (RAP) is now available for public consultation and will be open for feedback until Friday 14 April.

We invite all Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander First Nations' community members who live, work or visit Wyndham to get involved as well as the general Wyndham Community to read Wyndham's Draft RAP 2023-2025 and provide their feedback.

The RAP has been developed in collaboration and partnership with the Wyndham Reconciliation Advisory Committee (WRAC), Council's internal RAP Management Group (representing 23 council departments), the Bunurong Land Council Aboriginal Corporation and the Wadawurrung Traditional Owners Aboriginal Corporation.

The WRAC was formed in August 2021, following the recruitment of members through an Expression of Interest process. The call was for both Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander non-Indigenous community members who live, work, study, volunteer or have a connection to Wyndham.

The WRAC met monthly and has been the platform for engagement between Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander and non-Indigenous communities with Council across a broad range of issues and in setting a new Reconciliation vision for the Draft RAP2023-2025.

MORE OPTIONS TO KEEP WYNDHAM MOVING

Are you looking for more ways to stay active and get around town?

Wyndham's Active Transport Strategy is bringing more walking and cycling routes to our community than ever before.

Our goal is to create a connected network of safe and sustainable active transport options for all residents, including people with disability, parents with prams and families with young children who want to walk and ride around Wyndham.

That's why we're working hard to complete upgrades and create new infrastructure.

The ongoing works include new and upgraded paths benefitting 5,600 households and the broader communities in Hoppers Crossing, Werribee, Truganina, Williams Landing, Point Cook and Wyndham Vale.

Additionally, upgrades to shared user paths are on the way for Arndell Park (Forsyth Rd), Riversdale Drive, Skeleton Creek, and Laverton Creek. We're also upgrading the Federation Trail as part of the Greening the Pipeline Project.

Footpath upgrades are being completed in the precinct surrounding Cambridge Primary School, and following this work, upgrades will be completed in the Bellbridge neighbourhood and around Werribee Station.

A connected network will improve safety and health outcomes and ensure our residents have more environmentally friendly and affordable travel options.

Get ready for 24 hours of art, live music, movies and more at Wyndham City's newest festival – 24.

Presented by Wyndham City, this unique experience will transform Chirnside Park in Werribee into a wonderland, where every minute counts and every hour brings something new to enjoy over 24 hours.

This free arts festival kicks off at 6pm, on Saturday 6 May and will run through to 6pm Sunday 7 May, with the opportunity to stay up through the night, or drop in across the 24 hours.

From dusk the park will be buzzing with a fantastic line-up of live music on the Riverside Stage, a live action painting project turning an old car into a dazzling neon artwork and tunes from the alluring UKI – a giant, robotic insect on wheels with its own DJ decks!

As dusk fades to dark, the park will take on a magical glow with a garden of 400 illuminated flowers in bloom to enjoy through to the early hours of the morning.

Help create a large woven labyrinth in Archi-Loom, boogie into the night at the Silent Disco or be entranced by the other worldly Sacred Serfs and Illuminated Angels.

With dawn comes a Raga of Indian classical music and yoga for all ages.

Then, once the coffee kicks in, go for glory with an epic paper plane competition or pull up a beanbag at the 24 Hour Outdoor Cinema.

Meet MALUAL DENG



Originally from South Sudan, Malual came to Australia as a refugee and settled in Point Cook. A father of four children and leader in his community, Malual is passionate about breaking down barriers, providing information and building connections in his community.

He runs the South Sudanese Child First Education (SSCFE), a not-for-profit organisation with a vision for a successful African diaspora community working for peace, justice and equal opportunity in Australia and related communities in Africa.

Malual has been visiting the Point Cook library for nine years and recently became involved in other areas of the Point Cook Community Learning Centre.

After meeting with Team Leader at the Point Cook Community Learning Centre, he joined the Point Cook Cultural Community. This non-profit multicultural organisation caters for public events around Point Cook and organises the Wyndham Multicultural Lunar Festival.

Malual says the festival is a great opportunity for members of his community to get involved with the day, perform and have a presence at the festival together with other cultures. He feels it's important for children born in Australia to connect and dance with their elders to showcase and be proud of their culture.

As a result of working on the Wyndham Multicultural Lunar Festival, Malual has connected with Co-Local and took part in last month's Kaleidoscope 2023 African Festival at the Point Cook Pop up-Park.

Malual aspires to continue his community work, so it makes sense that he will soon facilitate a program to support the South Sudanese Community at the Point Cook Community Learning Centre!

This portfolio celebrates the many tourism attractions Wyndham has to offer and explores ways Wyndham can continue to attract visitors and businesses to the region by developing strategies to capitalise on Wyndham's natural assets and local attractions.

Wyndham has so many wonderful attractions on offer to discover in our own backyard and to showcase to visiting friends and family - there is something that will capture everyone's interest.

The beautiful Werribee Park Precinct features Werribee's Open Range Zoo, Werribee Park Mansion, Werribee Park National Equestrian Centre, the Victoria State Rose Garden and Shadowfax winery.

The \$88m redevelopment of Werribee Open Range Zoo will deliver a world class experience with a purpose built new elephant habitat to house the relocation of the Asian Elephant herd from Melbourne Zoo in 2024

The new state-of-the-art space at will provide 21 hectares to roam for the herd of 10 Asian Elephants including three new calves, Aiyara, Roi-Yim and Kati.

Other attractions across our City include the Point Cook Coastal Park, the K Road Cliffs, Wyndham Harbour, Werribee South foreshore, Cobbledicks Ford and Werribee River are natural wonders in our backyard that are not to be missed.

The Western Treatment Plant is one of our hidden gems with a thriving ecosystem and internationally-recognised bird habitat, with over 300 different species of birdlife.

For aviation enthusiasts the B24 Liberator restoration is Australia's only surviving World War II Liberator bomber, preserving history and providing public education.

POWERING UP TARNEIT

Tarneit is now home to one of Victoria's first neighbourhood batteries, which will store solar energy for use by the local community.

Located in Gleneagles Reserve, the battery will store energy produced by the sun during the day to be available at night when residents need it.

Tarneit and other Wyndham City suburbs have some of the highest rates of solar use on the network and providing this neighbourhood battery will allow more of the community to install solar and reduce their

energy costs by putting their solar energy back in the grid.
